Produced by the Riverfront Marketing Group (RMG) in partnership with the Mayor's Office of Cultural Economy and New Orleans Tourism and Cultural Fund, this spectacular fireworks display can be seen from the East and West Banks of the River from Hilton New Orleans Riverside to Crescent Park in the French Market District. And there's more! CNN will be showcasing the NOLA fireworks around the world as part of its "Fourth in America" special!

Choreographed to patriotic music, the display will feature hundreds of rapid-fire shells sweeping the sky at heights of 200 feet above the Mississippi River. Come down early and experience the reimagined and state-of-the-art **Audubon Aquarium** and **Audubon Insectarium**. Cruise the Mississippi on the *City of New Orleans*, or ride the river on the Paddlewheeler *Creole Queen*. Stroll **Crescent Park**, a 1.4-mile linear park that connects the community and visitors to the Riverfront in the French Market District. Take in the view atop **Vue Orleans**. Enjoy the pleasures of downtown New Orleans hotels, museums, restaurants, bars, and other attractions!

The **Port of New Orleans** will bring out the *General Roy S. Kelley* fireboat again this year with its famed water show with plumes of red, white, and blue fountains beginning at **7:00 p.m.** and leading up to the **9:00 p.m.** fireworks show. Built in 1994, the *General Kelley* was used by the **Port of New Orleans** to fight fires, give tours, and conduct search-and-rescue missions on the Mississippi River. The *General Kelley* is 95 feet long and 16 feet wide with a 7-foot. draft. It seats 24 and typically has a crew of three.

"Go 4th on the River is a nonprofit community project. Each year the Riverfront Marketing Group must start over to raise funds needed to produce this Independence Day celebration," says Adrienne Thomas, the RMG treasurer. "If fireworks are a backdrop for the Fourth of July festivities for your businesses, organizations, and family events, please consider contributing to our community effort to continue to produce this beloved New Orleans tradition."
